- Late entries may only be submitted online and will be accepted for 7 days after the official closing date (by 5.00 pm CST)
- An additional fee equivalent to three times the standard entry fee is paid.

Absolutely no exception to the above conditions will be made to any exhibitor under any circumstance.

MEMBERSHIP

Exhibitors need not be members of the Royal Agricultural & Horticultural Society of SA Inc, but RA&HS members are entitled to a reduced entry fee.

Exhibitors of fleece, production and/or young parader classes are exempt.

WITHDRAWALS

Every alpaca entered must be exhibited unless a statement, signed by the exhibitor, is lodged with the Society at least 14 days prior to the commencement of the Show stating why the animal/s is unable to compete (eg):

1. The animal has died.
2. The animal is unfit for exhibition due to injury or disease.
3. Some other cause which the Society considers reasonable.

Any late withdrawals must also be made in writing either as a Statutory Declaration signed by the exhibitor or a certificate signed by the exhibitor, together with an explanatory certificate signed by a veterinary surgeon.

All withdrawals must be clearly marked "Withdrawal – Alpaca section" and include exhibitor name, exhibit name, class number and exhibit number (if known). Withdrawals can be sent via email to entries@adelaideshowground.com.au.

REFUNDS

No refund of fees will be made after closing date of entries.

OWNERSHIP

All animals must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor or held by the exhibitor under a written and recorded lease at the time of entry.

PROPERTY IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (PIC)

The Royal Agricultural & Horticultural Society of SA Inc PIC number is SK901405.

EXHIBITOR RESPONSIBILITIES

It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure alpacas and fleeces are entered in the correct colour class according to the Australian Alpaca Association colour chart.

PENALTY FOR NON-EXHIBITION OF ANIMALS

Exhibitors who fail to notify the Society of withdrawals as detailed above at least 24 hours prior to the official arrival time will be fined \$100 for each animal not exhibited.

RESTRICTION OF ENTRIES

In the event of more entries being received than can be comfortably accommodated, and in order to encourage greater exhibitor numbers, the Society reserves the right to reduce the number of alpacas entered by any exhibitor to a figure determined by the Society. The exhibitor will have the right to nominate the alpacas to be withdrawn.

REGISTRATION

At the time of entry, all alpacas entered (other than wethers and alpacas in Young Parader and Young Judging classes) must be registered with a recognised organisation and, at the time of penning, must carry approved identification. All alpacas must be entered and shown in the name of the registered owner or leasee.

The Australian Alpaca Association database will be used to check entry details for accuracy.

Unregistered wethers and alpacas in Young Parader and Young Judging classes are excluded.

YOUR PRIVACY

By exhibiting at The Show you acknowledge that you have read and agree to the privacy policy of the RA&HS which can be viewed here [[linked to https://www.theshow.com.au/contact-us/](https://www.theshow.com.au/contact-us/)].

In relation to your entry into a competition we may specifically use and/or disclose your personal information to:

- Communicate competition information to you such as entry opening dates, delivery and collection details and entry ticket distribution
- Publish competition results both online and in printed results listings
- Publish competition entries in Competition Catalogues
- Advise sponsors of competition prize winners for distribution of prizes from both the RA&HS and sponsors

By entering into a competition you consent to your contact details being provided to the sponsors of that competition for the purpose of distributing your prize. You also consent to your name, suburb and postcode being listed in a competition catalogue and, if you are a prize winner your name in competition results.

If you do not wish for your name and address to be printed in a competition catalogue, please ensure that you select the 'Keep Private' option in your online exhibitor profile.

PRIZES AND AWARDS

Prizes in each class will be (unless otherwise specified):

First, \$20, ribbon; second, \$15, ribbon; third, \$5 ribbon.

RA&HS sashes will be awarded to all Champions, Reserve Champions and Special Awards.

PAYMENT OF PRIZE MONEY

Any prize money won during the Royal Adelaide Show is paid by Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT). The exhibitor should provide the BSB, Account Number and Account Name at time of original entry.

PRIZE MONEY WILL BE PAID BY THE END OF OCTOBER.

PRIZE MONEY AND GST

Prize money as stated in the Prize Schedule does not include GST.

The prize money which we pay to successful exhibitors depends on information provided to us. If you confirm that you are GST registered and provide your Australian Business Number (ABN), we will pay the appropriate prize money plus 10% GST. We will provide you with a Recipient Created Tax Invoice which you will need to submit to the Australian Taxation Office.

If you confirm you are registered for GST, in entering the competition, you acknowledge your agreement to the following:

- You will not issue a tax invoice to the RA&HS in respect to prize money received;
- You will notify the RA&HS if you cease to be registered for GST.

If you provide your ABN but are not registered for GST, we will pay the prize money as detailed in the Prize Schedule without reference to the GST.

If you confirm you are entering as part of a private recreational pursuit or hobby, we will pay the prize money as detailed in the Prize Schedule without reference to GST.

IMPORTANT

It is important that you either:

- Confirm you are entering as part of a private recreational pursuit or hobby, or
- Confirm you are entering as a GST registered business and supply your ABN

Failure to do either of the above will require the RA&HS to withhold tax, at the maximum tax rate, from your prize money in accordance with Australian tax legislation.

The RA&HS is not a tax consultant and therefore assumes no liability for actions taken as a result of these guidelines. In any instances where an entrant or sponsor is uncertain of the tax implications of their involvement, they should consult their own accountant or tax advisor.

The Society makes every endeavor to ensure all prizes listed are accurate at the time of publishing. Should a cash prize be withdrawn by a sponsor subsequent to publishing, the prize will revert back to the competitions default amount where applicable. Vouchers, product or trophies withdrawn by a sponsor subsequent to publishing will not be replaced. It is the responsibility of the prize winner to follow-up with the Society any sponsored prize (cash, voucher, product, trophy) they believe they are entitled to prior to 30 November in the year of the prize being awarded. The Society will not follow-up prize sponsors after this date or review any prizes that may have been incorrectly awarded..

GENERAL REGULATIONS

Exhibitors are reminded that the Society's General Regulations apply to all sections of the Show. A copy of the General Regulations can be obtained from the Society's website at www.theshow.com.au or from the Society's Administration Office. Exhibitors should note that the General Regulations contain a number of provisions relevant to competitions and this Schedule including but not limited to, offences, penalties, prohibited drugs. As those conditions apply in addition to the regulations contained within this schedule, Exhibitors should familiarise themselves with the General Regulations.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS

Exhibitors are reminded that the Special Regulations contained within this Schedule are merely supplementary to and subject to the General Regulations.

The members of the Society's Diverse Farming Committee shall have the authority to act on behalf of the Society to take any necessary action under these Special Regulations.

GENERAL INFORMATION

DELIVERY OF FLEECES

Fleeces may be delivered to the Secretary's Office, Adelaide Showground, Wayville or to the Supervisor, Kerry Porter, please phone Kerry on 0407 568 501.

All fleeces should be in plastic bags or plastic bags inside cloth bags (preferred), with identification of exhibitor and class number, as provided by Administration Office.

Fleeces not bagged correctly may be disqualified from competition.

Only one fleece that has been shorn in the 18 months prior to the Show may be shown from any one animal.

Fleeces, once judged will be displayed in the Alpaca and Goat Pavilion for the duration of the Royal Adelaide Show.

ARRIVAL OF ALPACAS

Arrival times will be staggered, and exhibitors will be advised of their allotted arrival time two weeks prior to the Show.

Alpacas not arriving by their specified arrival time may be disqualified by the Chief Steward.

Alpacas must not be moved from their allotted pen whilst judging is in progress, except by the order of the Chief Steward. Alpacas must not leave the judging ring until directed by the Judge or Ring Steward.

Any attempts at delivery of fleeces or arrival of Alpacas outside of these times will not be accepted.

ENTRY GATE

All vehicles are to enter through the Leader Street Gate.

GENERAL INSPECTIONS

Each alpaca shall be inspected for general well-being, eligibility, correctness and lice. Inspections shall be conducted according to the Stewards Inspection Checklist as shown in the AAA Showing Rules Manual (January 2019).

REMOVAL OF VEHICLES

Exhibitors are required to remove their vehicles from the Showground immediately after animals have been inspected and penned.

AGE AND DATE OF BIRTH

1 September, 2024 is the reference date for the calculation of age of an animal for the purposes of entering age classes at the Royal Adelaide Show.

The following table shows the birth dates between which animals must have been born in order to be eligible for each age class.

6 months to under 12 months - 2/9/23 to 1/3/24
12 months to under 18 months - 2/3/23 to 1/9/23
18 months to under 30 months - 2/3/22 to 1/3/23
30 months to under 48 months - 2/9/21 to 1/3/22
30 months and over - On or before 1/3/21
48 months and over - born on or before 1/9/20

INSPECTION OF ALPACAS

The Society shall appoint a person or persons as an inspector or inspectors who shall then examine all alpacas for eligibility.

All alpacas will be inspected for lice upon arrival and prior to entering the Pavilion.

Any decision or determination of disqualification is entirely within the discretion of the Chief Steward and shall not be challenged or called into question in any proceedings or in any manner whatsoever. The Chief Steward will classify all entries for colour and has the power to transfer an exhibit to the class in which, in his/her opinion, it should have been entered. The Chief Steward may combine or split classes as he/she sees fit in consultation with the Supervisor.

Alpacas should be shorn annually. Halter class entry must have a minimum fleece length of 50 millimetres for Huacaya and Suri, and a maximum fleece age:

- for Huacaya of under 14 months.
- for Suri in a first fleece of under 18 months, and
- for Suri in a second or subsequent fleece of under 14 months.

DRESS CODE

- Handlers and all stewards appearing in or near the arena must wear
- AAA logo black shirt, with or without AAA logo black vest, over black pants and covered shoes.
- Juniors must have long trousers (moleskins or school trousers accepted) with covered shoes.
- NO blue denim jeans, shorts or sneakers permitted.

Stewards assisting inside the pavilion must be smartly dressed.

White dustcoats should be worn by handlers in the Grand Parade. (AAA has a range that can be borrowed at the time)

BEDDING

A straw allocation will be supplied for bedding for alpacas. Additional straw may be purchased from the Shed Supervisor.

FODDER

Exhibitors must arrange their own fodder requirements.

The Fodder Store is located on the Showground at the western end of the Tin Dairy. All sales will be by credit card only.

Any exhibitor who, in the opinion of the Committee, has more fodder than is considered necessary, will be required to remove the excess from the Showground.

Exhibitors must not solicit orders for fodder on the Showground.

PEN CLEANING

Exhibitors shall, to the satisfaction of the Alpaca Supervisor:

1. Keep each pen allotted to them and their alpacas in a clean and proper condition throughout the Show.
2. Cleaning of pens is to be completed before 8.00 am each day. Pens to be maintained throughout the day.
3. Wastewater must not be emptied in the goat wash-down sinks.

PARADES

All award-winning alpacas are expected to be paraded in any Grand Parade conducted during the stay of alpacas at the Showground. Parading of all exhibits is encouraged. Penalties may be imposed upon exhibitors who do not participate.

EXERCISING OF ALPACAS

Exercising alpacas will only be permitted during the times set and within designated areas. (Details to be provided to exhibitors).

DISPLAY CARDS/PEN DISPLAYS

Each stud is permitted to display one sign for every four pens occupied by exhibits, no larger than 1200 mm x 600 mm. Logo, name and address of stud only to be displayed.

Exhibitors are permitted to decorate their pens with curtain delineators – more information on size restrictions will be provided closer to the Show.

Ribbons and sashes on display must relate to the alpaca/s in that pen. No exhibitor shall display any prize card, exhibit card, or ribbon on their animal or pen other than those issued by the Society for the current Show. All awards must be removed as soon as the winning alpacas leave the Showground.

PROTESTS

An exhibitor may lodge a protest against another exhibitor or a Show Official. The sole grounds of a protest shall be a breach of the Show rules.

Subject to the General Regulations, protests shall be addressed to the Chief Executive and be lodged at his office on the Showground before 6.00 pm on the day the decision in question has been made. Such protests shall be accompanied by a deposit of \$50 which may be forfeited to the Society if in the sole opinion of the Chief Steward the protest is unfounded, frivolous or vexatious.

The protest and all matters arising therefrom shall be determined conclusively as to all matters by the Society and shall not be the subject of any appeal to any court.

FIRE PRECAUTIONS

Precautions will be taken to guard against fire, and to protect the property at the Show.

Exhibits will not be insured at the cost of the Society.

Smoking is strictly prohibited in all livestock pavilions.

No exhibitor or other person shall remove, or displace, or interfere in any way, or use for any purpose other than the prevention of fire, any article or appliance provided for use in the case of an outbreak of fire upon the Showground, nor shall any exhibitor or other person remove or alter, or add to, or interfere in any way with any fixture, fitting, article, appliance or thing owned by the Society, or used in such fixture, fitting, article, appliance or thing for any purpose other than for which it is intended by the Society to be used.

ALCOHOL

The consumption of alcohol in all pavilions, halls and attendant's lockers is forbidden.

PRODUCTION CLASSES

Normal entry requirements must be met including health requirements and registrations.

COMPANION ALPACAS

No companion alpacas or bottle fed cria are permitted. Cria at foot may be brought onto the Showground only with permission of the Supervisor.

DUTY OF CARE

It is important to ensure your own safety and that of all other site personnel, visitors and general public at the Adelaide Showground.

CRITERIA FOR ALPACAS ON DISPLAY FOR THE SECOND HALF OF THE SHOW

Aim

To have approximately 30 alpacas remain for the second half of the Show.

Criteria

- The same rules and regulations, including ownership, apply for all alpacas on display during the second half of the Show. Proof of ownership and animal ID must be provided for each alpaca to the satisfaction of the Alpaca Supervisor. Alpacas may be registered or unregistered.
- The same health standards and rules apply.
- Normal shed rules apply (ie cleaning, exercising, signage etc).
- No alpacas under 6 months of age allowed except naturally feeding cria at foot when exhibited with dam. No bottle fed cria permitted.
- First preference will be given to those showing and those assisting during the first half of the Show (ie exhibitors, stewards, official volunteers). If space permits, other breeders and owners may participate.
- Owners may negotiate, through the Alpaca Supervisor, to swap over alpacas. Additional Health and Movement documentation must be completed.
- Advertising and Signage

- The Alpaca Pavilion is a competitive and display venue - not a commercial site. The second half of the Show presents an opportunity to have alpacas on display with owners present to interact with the public and promote the industry.
- Display cards should be consistent with those permitted in the first half of the Show ie no larger than 1200 mm x 600 mm, with logo, name and contact details shown.
- No "For Sale" signs or hand-outs listing alpacas for sale are permitted. Other handouts which advertise or promote specific enterprises or animals must not be displayed or distributed.
- Fact Sheets, posters and other general educational material promoting the alpaca industry are permitted.
- Business cards are permitted but strictly no persuasion, coercion or selling is allowed from the Alpaca & Goat Pavilion.
- A designated industry display area will be provided, and no individual promotion will be permitted in this area.

ANIMAL HEALTH

JOHNES DISEASE

Alpaca must not be from properties known to be infected with Johnes's Disease. All Exhibitors must complete a "[National South American Camelid Declaration and Waybill](#)" and submit at the time of entry. Documentation must be current at the time of entries and for the duration of the Show. A current copy of the form should travel with interstate exhibitors and be available for border inspection. Questions about eligibility or obtaining forms may be directed to PIRSA Murray Bridge Office on 08 8539 2112.

LICE

All exhibitors should carefully check all alpacas for lice before bringing them onto the Adelaide Showground. Alpacas will be inspected for *Bovicola breviceps* (alpaca biting or chewing lice) prior to entering the Alpaca and Goat Pavilion. Any alpaca found to be carrying signs of lice infestation (lice - dead or alive, eggs, scurf) will be disqualified together with all other entries by that exhibitor. Exhibits must be removed immediately from the Showground. Entry fees will not be refunded.

HORMONAL GROWTH PROMOTANTS

As stipulated in the Society's General Regulations - Prohibited Drugs, alpacas which have been treated with hormones are not eligible for entry or exhibition at the Royal Adelaide Show.

PHYSICAL SOUNDNESS & DISAPPROVED EXHIBITS

All male animals must be completely entire and deemed physically sound. Any male not deemed completely entire (other than a wether) shall not compete. Any marks of spaying on females shall disqualify them from competing.

All wethers must be physically sound and must have been castrated. Any wether entry may be either a registered or unregistered alpaca.

All animals exhibited must be of a satisfactory standard, be in reasonable show condition and be given proper attention during the Show.

Any exhibit, disapproved for exhibition by the Inspector or Chief Steward, must upon notice to that effect, be removed from the Showground.

SICK OR DISEASED ANIMALS

If, in the opinion of a qualified Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the Society, an animal on the Showground shall be injured or be so affected by sickness, disease or other ailment as to warrant its destruction or its removal from the Showground as the case may be, the Society shall be entitled to have the animal destroyed and/or require the animal to be forthwith removed from the Showground. The exhibitor, upon receipt of such notice, shall forthwith remove such animal and failing such removal by him/her within the time prescribed by the Society, by written notice to the exhibitor or his/her representative on the Showground, the Society may remove the animal or cause the animal to be removed. All costs and expenses of removal shall be borne by the exhibitor, and shall be refunded to the Society.

Each such animal shall at all times be the sole risk and responsibility of the exhibitor and the person or persons removing the animal shall at all times be deemed to be agents of the exhibitor and all acts and omissions on the part of such person or persons shall be deemed to be acts and omissions of the exhibitor. The exhibitor shall indemnify and hold indemnified the Society, its servants and agents from all claims whatsoever in respect of the animal whether by reason of any loss or injury to or caused by the animal or because of transportation, feeding or housing or otherwise howsoever.

The Alpaca Supervisor must be advised immediately of any sick or diseased animals attended to by the Society's Veterinary Surgeon.

All exhibitors are reminded of their obligation to ensure all animals are adequately fed, have access to fresh water and pens are kept clean.

YOUNG JUDGES COMPETITION

The Alpaca Young Judge Competition encourages young people between the ages of 15 and 25 years to participate.

Depending on entry numbers, classes may be divided.

Exhibitors will be required to judge four alpacas (Huacaya only in 2024) and up to four fleeces (Huacaya only in 2024) and give a verbal summary of their assessments and rankings.

To be eligible to compete, a competitor must have either competed in Junior Judging at a previous show (at regional or Royal Show level) and/or have attended a recognised Young Judging Training Course within the 18 months prior to the 2024 Royal Adelaide Show.

SPECIAL AWARDS

MOST SUCCESSFUL NEW EXHIBITOR IN BREED & FLEECE CLASSES

Open to any exhibitor showing for the first time. Any exhibitor showing at the Royal Adelaide Show in 2024 is eligible for this Trophy. Points will be awarded based upon the success of entries in ALL Alpaca Sections - Huacaya, Suri, Production and Fleeces.

MOST SUCCESSFUL ALPACA EXHIBITOR IN BREED & FLEECE CLASSES

Any exhibitor showing at the Royal Adelaide Show in 2024 is eligible for this award. Points will be awarded based upon the success of entries in ALL Alpaca Sections - Huacaya, Suri, Production and Fleeces.

A sliding scale of points, reflecting the level of any award, will be used:-

First -	5 points
Second -	3 points
Third -	1 points

The exhibitor with the highest points score shall be the winner.

Should a tie occur, the number of entries by the tied exhibitors may be considered to determine the winner.

THE URRBRAE PRIZE BEST OVERALL SCHOOL

This award is open to student exhibitors who enter in class Wethers and the Junior Handlers and Young Judges classes at the Royal Adelaide Show in 2024. Points will be awarded based upon the point system on placing of these classes/sections.

A sliding scale of points, reflecting the level of any award, will be used:-

COMPOSITE APPRAISAL

ROYAL ADELAIDE SHOW - EXHIBITORS CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

HAZARD REPORTING

Exhibitors must notify the Area/Pavilion Supervisor or the Venue Control Centre immediately of any hazards detected. Hazards are any situation which has the potential to cause:

1. Injury, illness or death to people or animals either immediately or in the future
2. Damage or destruction to property

INCIDENT REPORTING

Exhibitors must notify the Area/Pavilion Supervisor or the Venue Management Office immediately an incident occurs which has resulted in:

1. The injury, illness or death of any person or animal
2. The damage, destruction or loss of property
3. A near miss incident that could have resulted in the consequences listed in 1 and 2

WASTE DISPOSAL

All waste including liquids must be disposed of responsibly and placed in the appropriate bin or receptacle. Storm drains must not be used for the disposal of any waste.

HAZARD MINIMISATION

All areas must be kept in a clean and tidy order with clearly defined and available access and exit routes at all times. Build-up of combustible waste must be avoided.

Care must be taken to minimise trip hazards and obstacles that people may walk into.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

The RA&HS are to be advised of all hazardous materials that are brought onto the Showground. Appropriate warning signs and Safety Data Sheets (SDS) will need to be provided before allowing these materials on site. SDS are to be available onsite and provided immediately upon request by an RA&HS Representative.

MEDIA COMMENTS

Any public comment on emergencies, incidents or other venue matters should only come from the RA&HS. The key media spokesperson for the RA&HS is the Marketing Manager.

DUTY OF CARE

It is important to ensure your own safety and that of all other site personnel, visitors and general public at the Adelaide Showground.

All competitors have a "Duty of Care" to avoid exposing themselves or other people to situations which could lead to injury. This "Duty of Care" extends to the prevention of damage to property.

LIABILITY AND INDEMNITY

1. Release

- Entry to and remaining on the Showground is entirely at the risk of the Exhibitor and to the maximum extent permitted by law, the Exhibitor releases the Society (which term includes in this clause the Society's officers, employees, members and agents), from all claims and demands of every kind resulting from any accident, damage or injury occurring at the Showground, and without limitation, the Exhibitor acknowledges:
 - the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to or caused by any Exhibit;
 - the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to or caused by any Exhibit, his or her family, invitees and Agents;
 - the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to a Motor Vehicle or any of its contents whilst it is located on the Showground; and
 - without limiting Regulations 1 (a) and 1 (b) above, the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury resulting from the sale, treatment, failure to treat, destruction, disposal or other dealing with any Exhibit, or for loss, damage or injury to any personal belongings, equipment or property brought onto the Showground.

2. Indemnity

To the maximum extent permitted by law, the Exhibitor must indemnify and keep indemnified the Society and its officers,

employees, members and agents from and against all actions, claims, demands, losses, damages, costs, expenses and liabilities including without limitation, consequential loss and loss of profits for which the Society is or may be or become liable in respect of or arising from:

a) loss, damage or injury to any person in connection with the Exhibit or the relevant Event;

b) without limiting Regulation 2(a), loss, damage or injury to any other Exhibit or Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees, Agents, or to the property of the Society, or its members, or to the general public, caused or contributed to or by any act or omission of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor or by the Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees or Agents; and

c) without limiting Regulation 2(a), loss, damage or injury to the Exhibit, or the Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees, or Agents caused or contributed by an act or omission of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor or by the transportation, feeding or housing of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor.

3. Removal from Showground

Without prejudice to any other provision in these Regulations, where the Society, its officers, employees, members or agents removes an Exhibit, or causes an Exhibit to be removed from the Showground, the Exhibit is removed or caused to be removed entirely at the risk of the Exhibitor. The person or persons removing the Exhibit will be deemed to be the agent of the Exhibitor, and his or her acts and omissions will be deemed to be the acts and omissions of the Exhibitor.

4. Insurance

The Society will arrange Animal Exhibitors Public Liability insurance cover for all Exhibitors of Exhibits being animals. The Exhibitor is bound by the terms and conditions of this insurance and by Statutory Duties as defined under the Insurance Contracts Act (1984). Details of the Animal Exhibitors Public Liability insurance are set out in the Relevant Schedule. The Society does not insure first party loss, damage or injury to Exhibits, and Exhibitors should consider purchasing insurance if required.

5. Personal effects

The Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss or damage caused to personal belongings, equipment or property which is brought onto the Showground by an Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees or Agents.

EMERGENCY INFORMATION

Emergency information and Emergency Assembly Points for the various animal pavilions and stables will be included with Exhibitor List of Entries and Notice to Exhibitor notifications. Competitors should be familiar with these plans.

FIRST AID

During the Royal Adelaide Show, St John provides First Aid Services but it is suggested that competitors have a basic First Aid kit for minor medical requirements.

St John is not in attendance after public hours.

For emergency contact details, check Notice Boards for onsite assistance or dial 000 for a medical emergency.

RA&HS EMERGENCY FACILITIES

Firefighting and other emergency equipment must not be removed or used for any other purpose. Missing or unserviceable equipment should be reported to the Venue Control Centre immediately.

SMOKING

Smoking is only permitted in designated locations. The Royal Adelaide Show is a smoke free event.

TRAFFIC CONTROL

The RA&HS Traffic Control Policy imposes speed restrictions within the Showground. For the duration of the Royal Adelaide Show the speed limit is 10 kph on the grounds and 8 kph inside buildings.

The use of vehicles inside the Showground is closely managed during the Royal Adelaide Show. Conditions of entry will be provided with the issue of Vehicle Entry Permits.
