WITHDRAWALS

All withdrawals must be made in writing and can be sent via email to entries@adelaideshowground.com.au. Emailed withdrawals must include "Withdrawal" in the subject line and the section (eg horticulture exhibitor name, class number, exhibit number (if known) and exhibit name (if applicable). Withdrawals must be made at least 24 hours prior to judging.

REFUNDS

No refund of entry fees will be made after the closing date of entries.

TRANSFERS

No refund of entry fees will be made after the closing date of entries.

ENTRY PASSES

All exhibitors will be given admission tickets for the day/s on which exhibits will be judged and/or removed if required, during the Show. Additional passes maybe issued by the Supervisor if considered appropriate.
School and Display Entries -Please contact the Horticulture Coordinator re ticket requests.

PARKING

Exhibitors that require parking access during the Show will be provided with an Exhibitor Car Park Pass for delivery during the allocated times. Exhibitors staging in the morning must arrive by 9.30 am.

- Advise sponsors of competition prize winners for distribution of prizes from both the RA&HS and sponsors

By entering into a competition you consent to your contact details being provided to the sponsors of that competition for the purpose of distributing your prize. DELIVERY OF EXHIBITS

HI VIZ VESTS: Exhibitors will be required to wear Hi Viz Vests when leaving exhibits Pre Show and collecting Exhibits post Show - unless you enter and exit via the fenced pathway from the Rose Terrace 1 Car Park to the Goyder Pavilion. Hi Viz Vests will be available at the Goyder Plaza Gate for a refundable deposit of \$5.

Garden Tools and Scissors needed to display Exhibits

Exhibitors are reminded to have any small tools used in presenting their entries, ready for inspection by Security at the Goyder Plaza Entrance Gate.

LOCATION OF EXHIBITS:

Horticulture will be exhibited in the northern end of Goyder Pavilion.

REMOVALS DURING SHOW

For removals during the Show Exhibitors will need to collect an Exhibitors Pass from the Horticulture Supervisor upon delivery. Exhibitors must provide their List of Entries for inspection when collecting exhibits

COLLECTION

Any prize cards, medallions, trophies and prizes (excluding cash) not collected by 11am on Monday 9 September will be available from 10 am to 4 pm - Monday 16 to Friday 20 September at the Secretary's Office. Exhibitors are reminded to bring the List of Entries as proof of ownership when collecting Horticulture Exhibits.

PRIZES AND AWARDS

Prize money will be awarded as stated. Third place prize money may be awarded providing there are 5 or more entries in the class. A Society medal may be awarded to the "Most Outstanding Exhibitor" in the Horticulture section at the Royal Adelaide Show.

- In all classes, prizes will be awarded to the successful exhibitors.
- It is the exhibitor's responsibility to collect awarded prize cards from their exhibit at the time of removal.
- Prize ribbons for 1st and 2nd place winners.
- Prize ribbons for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners in Bonsai and Floral Art Classes.
- Sashes for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners in the Scarecrow Competition, Schools Kitchen Garden, Floristry & TAFE SA Floristry.
- Prize Cards will be provided for all place winners.
- Participation Certificates will be provided to all exhibitors in the Scarecrow Competition and Junior & Teenage Sections.
- RA&HS Prize Sashes will be awarded to all Champions, Best Feature Garden and Most Successful Exhibitors.

BANKSIAN MEDAL

This award is offered by the Royal Horticulture Society, England for a display of horticultural excellence.

PAYMENT OF PRIZE MONEY

Any prize money won during the Royal Adelaide Show is paid by Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT). The Exhibitor should provide the BSB, Account Number and Account Name when entering.

PRIZE MONEY WILL BE PAID BY THE END OF OCTOBER.

PRIZE MONEY AND GST

Prize money as stated in the Prize Schedule does not include GST.

The prize money which we pay to successful exhibitors depends on information provided to us. If you confirm that you are GST registered and provide your Australian Business Number (ABN), we will pay the appropriate prize money plus 10% GST. We will provide you with a Recipient Created Tax Invoice which you will need to submit to the Australian Taxation Office.

If you confirm you are registered for GST, in entering the competition, you acknowledge your agreement to the following:

- You will not issue a tax invoice to the RA&HS in respect to prize money received;
- You will notify the RA&HS if you cease to be registered for GST.

If you provide your Australian Business Number but are not registered for GST, we will pay the prize money as detailed in the Competition Schedule without reference to the GST.

If you confirm you are entering as part of a private recreational pursuit or hobby, we will pay the prize money as detailed in the Competition Schedule without reference to GST.

IMPORTANT

It is important that you either:

- Confirm you are entering as part of a private recreational pursuit or hobby, or
- Confirm you are entering as a GST registered business and supply your ABN

Failure to do either of the above will require the RA&HS to withhold tax, at the maximum tax rate, from your prize money in accordance with Australian tax legislation. The RA&HS is not a tax consultant and therefore assumes no liability for actions taken as a result of these guidelines. In any instances where an entrant or sponsor is uncertain of the tax implications of their involvement, they should consult their own accountant or tax advisor.

The Society makes every endeavor to ensure all prizes listed are accurate at the time of publishing. Should a cash prize be withdrawn by a sponsor subsequent to publishing, the prize will revert back to the competitions default amount where applicable. Vouchers, product or trophies withdrawn by a sponsor subsequent to publishing will not be replaced. It is the responsibility of the prize winner to follow-up with the Society any sponsored prize (cash, voucher, product, trophy) they believe they are entitled to prior to 30 November in the year of the prize being awarded. The Society will not follow-up prize sponsors after this date or review any prizes that may have been incorrectly.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

Exhibitors are reminded that the Society's General Regulations apply to all sections of the Show. A copy of the General Regulations can be obtained from the Society's website at www.theshow.com.au or from the Society's Administration Office. Exhibitors should note that the General Regulations contain a number of provisions relevant to competitions and this Schedule including but not limited to, offences, penalties, prohibited drugs. As those conditions apply in addition to the regulations contained within this schedule, Exhibitors should familiarise themselves with the General Regulations.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS

Exhibitors are reminded that the Special Regulations contained within this Schedule are merely supplementary to and subject to the General Regulations.

The members of the Society's Beef Cattle Committee shall have the authority to act on behalf of the Society to take any necessary action under these Special Regulations.

RESTRICTION OF ENTRIES

The Horticulture Committee reserves the right to limit the number of entries in any class, if entries exceed available exhibition space. Entry fees will be refunded in this circumstance.

All ages will be calculated as at the 1st of September of the current year.

EXHIBITS

- Any exhibit not displaying the exhibitor's number at the commencement of the judging cannot be judged.
- When plants and flowers are individually displayed, plant name must be affixed to the exhibit. Cards for this purpose will be supplied by the Society and can be obtained from the hall supervisor.
- Plants and flowers should be free from pests and diseases at the time of judging.
- No exhibitor will be allowed to remain in the hall during judging.
- The Society will under no circumstance hold itself responsible for any loss, damage to, or mis delivery of any exhibit.

On the day of staging, please bring your "List of Entries" and hand to the Supervisor for checking.

JUDGING

The judge's decision will be final, and no correspondence or discussion will be entered into. In all classes, where a number of species and/or cultivars are called for, judges will take into account the difficulties associated with their cultivation.

Judges are empowered to withhold prizes in any class where exhibits are below acceptable standard. They may award second prize in lieu of first.

No exhibitor or exhibitor's agent shall act as a judge or steward in a class in which he/she exhibits.

MOST SUCCESSFUL EXHIBITOR AWARDS

Points to be allocated as follows:

First, 5 points; second, 3 points; third, 1 point.

DEFINITIONS

Novice exhibitor - A novice exhibitor is one who has not won a First Prize at any Royal Show in the section in which that exhibitor is competing.

Bloom - one flower displayed on a single stem

Cut - Two or more flowers or florets displayed on a single stem or a stem with secondary branches.

PLANTS IN CONTAINERS

- The size of the containers is set out in the schedule.
- A maximum space of 500mm x 500mm will be allocated per entry.
- Exhibitors to supply own saucer. Exhibits without saucers will not be watered.
- Plants must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor for a minimum of 40 days prior the close of entries.
- Every plant must be established in the container in which it is shown and be free from pests and disease at the time of judging.

JUNIOR SECTION

Please refer to the inside front cover for Closing Date of Entries, Staging, Judging and Removal times.

Open to all children 12 years old and under, as at 1 September of the current year.

Date of birth to be stated on the entry form.

Exhibits requiring pre-arrangement, may be delivered completed when prepared under the supervision of a recognised teacher or youth group leader.

Exhibitors to supply own container and equipment.

JUNIOR - PLANTS IN CONTAINERS

- A maximum space of 500mm x 500mm will be allocated per entry.
- Exhibitors to supply own saucer. **Exhibits without saucers will not be watered.**
- **Plants must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor for a minimum of 40 days prior to close of entries.**
- Every plant must be established in the container in which it is shown, and be free from pests and diseases at the time of judging.
- The size of the container must not exceed 300mm in diameter.
- Weeds or pest plants are not eligible for competition.
- Plants should be labelled indicating their name (common name if botanical name is not known)
- Potted plant exhibits remain for the duration of the Show.

Class 3 Pot Plant, Succulent, one.
