PAYMENT OF FEES

When paying fees by cheque or credit card, exhibitors must ensure that sufficient funds are available at the time of entry. Failure to do so may result in non-acceptance of entries. Cheques should be made payable to RA&HS and posted with the completed entry form.

REFUNDS

No refund of entry fees will be made after the closing date of entries unless there is a cancellation of any class. A copy of the current Sheep Health Statement must be supplied at the time of entry.

WITHDRAWALS

All withdrawals must be made in writing and can be sent via email to: entries@adelaideshowground.com.au Emailed withdrawals must include "Withdrawal" in the subject line and the section (eg Sheep Section), exhibitor name, class number, exhibit number (if known) and exhibit name (if applicable). Withdrawals must be made at least 24 hours prior to judging.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS

Exhibitors are reminded that the Society's General Regulations apply to all sections of the Show and that the Special Regulations hereunder set out, which apply to this section only, are merely supplementary to and subject to the General Regulations. A copy of

the General Regulations may be obtained from the Society's website at www.theshow.com.au or upon request from the Society's Administration Office.

YOUR PRIVACY

By exhibiting at The Show you acknowledge that you have read and agree to the privacy policy of the RA&HS which can be <u>viewed</u> here.

In relation to your entry into a competition we may specifically use and/or disclose your personal information to:

- Communicate competition information to you such as entry opening dates, delivery and collection details and entry ticket distribution
- Publish competition results both online and in printed results listings
- Publish competition entries in Competition Catalogues
- Advise sponsors of competition prize winners for distribution of prizes from both the RA&HS and sponsors

By entering into a competition you consent to your contact details being provided to the sponsors of that competition for the purpose of distributing your prize. You also consent to your name, suburb and postcode being listed in a competition catalogue and, if you are a prize winner your name in competition results.

RESTRICTIONS ON ENTRIES

All entries must be entered under the correct stud name. An owner of two or more registered studs in one breed shall treat each stud as separate exhibitors.

All exhibitors, except for Group Classes drawn from general classes, will be permitted to make only two entries in any one class. There shall be no restrictions on the number of entries in any one class in the Merino Section.

Sheep may not compete in more than one class, except where otherwise specified.

Lambs at foot are eligible to compete in Lamb classes.

There is no restriction on the number of entries for objective measurement classes.

Should the number of entries exceed the accommodation available, the Society reserves the right to further restrict the number of entries.

PRIZES

Prizes in each class will be:
First, \$20, ribbon; second, ribbon; third, ribbon (unless otherwise specified).
In addition to the prizes listed, the following may be awarded:
7 to 10 exhibits – 4th ribbon
11 to 15 exhibits – 5th ribbon.
16 to 20 exhibits – 6th ribbon.
Over 20 exhibits – commended ribbons at the discretion of the judge.
In Feature Breed classes, judges may award to 6th position regardless of the number of entries.

SASHES

RA&HS sashes will be awarded to all placings, Champions and Reserve Champions, Breeders Group and Sires Progeny. School Wether Competition winners will receive RA&HS Sashes. Participation sashes for Young Handler Competitions.

PAYMENT OF PRIZE MONEY

It is the preference of the RA&HS that any prize money won during the Royal Adelaide Show is paid by Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT). The Exhibitor should provide the BSB, Account Number and Account Name on the space provided on the entry form. PRIZE MONEY WILL BE PAID BY THE END OF OCTOBER.

The Society makes every endeavour to ensure all prizes listed are accurate at the time of publishing. Should a cash prize be withdrawn by a sponsor subsequent to publishing, the prize will revert back to the competitions default amount where applicable. Vouchers, product or trophies withdrawn by a sponsor subsequent to publishing will not be replaced. It is the responsibility of the prize winner to follow-up with the Society any sponsored prize (cash, voucher, product, trophy) they believe they are entitled to prior to 30 November in the year of the prize being awarded. The Society will not follow-up prize sponsors after this date or review any prizes that may have been incorrectly awarded.

PRIZE MONEY AND GST

Prize money as stated in the Prize Schedule does not include GST.

The prize money which we pay to successful exhibitors depends on information provided to us. If you confirm that you are GST registered and provide your Australian Business Number (ABN), we will pay the appropriate prize money plus 10% GST. We will provide you with a Recipient Created Tax Invoice which you will need to submit to the Australian Taxation Office. If you confirm you are registered for GST, in entering the competition, you acknowledge your agreement to the following:

- You will not issue a tax invoice to the RA&HS in respect to prize money received;
- You will notify the RA&HS if you cease to be registered for GST.

If you provide your Australian Business Number but are not registered for GST, we will pay the prize money as detailed in the Prize Schedule without reference to the GST.

If you confirm you are entering as part of a private recreational pursuit or hobby, we will pay the prize money as detailed in the Prize Schedule without reference to GST.

IMPORTANT

It is important that you either:

- · Confirm you are entering as part of a private recreational pursuit or hobby, or
- Confirm you are entering as a GST registered business and supply your ABN

Failure to do either of the above will require the RA&HS to withhold tax, at the maximum tax rate, from your prize money in accordance with Australian tax legislation.

The RA&HS is not a tax consultant and therefore assumes no liability for actions taken as a result of these guidelines. In any instances where an entrant or sponsor is uncertain of the tax implications of their involvement, they should consult their own accountant or tax advisor.

SPECIAL AWARDS

Champions will be selected from first prize winners, and Reserve Champions from remaining first prize winners and the second prize winner in the class that supplied the Champion.

If one sheep of a pair is awarded the Championship, the owner of the second prize winning pair has the right to parade the second prize winning pair for the Reserve Championship award. The judge shall have the right to select a sheep from a placegetting pair, to be eligible for the Championship for all breeds other than Merino.

Judges are empowered to withhold prizes in any class without assigning any reason therefore.

REGISTRATION OF SHEEP

Vall sheep shall be registered in a recognised Flock Book and shall conform to the regulations contained therein. All exhibitors must be a current financial member of their respective Breed Society. Any sheep not complying with the above conditions may forfeit any prize or prizes which may have been awarded.

ENTRY PASSES

Exhibitors- Full Show Pass- 1 per 6 head (Max. 2 passes) Merino Wether Class Exhibitors- 30 Competitor passes per entry, if more than 1 entry/school + 15 Competitor passes for 2nd class.

ARRIVAL OF SHEEP

Refer to timetables on inside of front cover and in the Merino, Poll Merino, Prime SAMM section.

Exhibitors will be required to remove their vehicles immediately sheep have been unloaded and penned.

Exhibitors not removing their vehicles will be subject to a penalty.

Exhibitors will need to apply for a vehicle permit and nominate a time for arrival. Exhibitors expecting to arrive outside of the nominated times are requested to notify the Pastoral Committee or contact the Sheep Supervisor via 08 8210 5211 prior to the start of the Show. Sheep will be housed in the Sheep Pavilion on the western boundary of the Showground, close to the Leader Street entrance.

ENTRY GATE

Entry between 8am and 5pm Thursday 28 August and 8am and 11am Friday 29 August via Leader Street Gate. Saturday 30 August – sheep will only be admitted before 8am. Entry will be via the Leader Street Gate.

CONDY'S CRYSTALS

The use of Condy's Crystals is discouraged at the Show. Should use be required they must be disposed of appropriately.

INSPECTIONS

Objective measurement figures must be displayed on pen cards before inspections and all sheep must be placed in the correct pens. Sheep found to be in the wrong pen at time of inspection will be disqualified.

STOCK TRUCK PARKING

An area at Morphettville Racecourse is available for the parking of stock trucks during the Royal Adelaide Show. For further information including the latest pricing, please contact Administration on (08) 8210 5211.

ALL EXHIBITORS NVD AND NSHS

A National Sheep Health Statement must accompany ALL sheep to the Show, and be produced before unloading, to Society official at the Showground. Failure to do so shall exclude the stock from the Show and may result in penalty (Livestock Act 2007).

NLIS TAGS

All sheep must be NLIS compliant. This means all animals must be tagged with an approved NLIS eartag (including lambs at foot), and accompanied by a completed National Vendor Declaration (NVD) or approved alternative movement document available at <u>www.pir.sa.gov.au</u>

The RA&HS of SA will notify the database of all movements onto the Showground on behalf of exhibitors.

Animals must not have been exposed to any communicable/notifiable disease/s within 14 days prior to the show.

OVINE JOHNE'S DISEASE POLICY TO ATTEND THE ROYAL ADELAIDE SHOW

Entries for the 2025 Royal Adelaide Show will be accepted from any registered stud.

Non - MAP or Unvaccinated sheep will be penned separately and cleanliness in the shed should be of a high standard. Sheep flocks that have a current OJD status of infected or suspected, or have been infected with OJD within the past 5 years, are NOT permitted entry to the Royal Adelaide Show.

KED, LICE. FOOTROT

Sheep infested with ked, lice, footrot or any notifiable disease are ineligible for competition, and exhibitors, on notification of infestations, will be removed as soon as possible on advice from PIRSA. Exhibitors please note: long wool lice treatment is not acceptable for sheep entered in the Royal Adelaide Show.

BRUCELLOSIS REQUIREMENTS

Sheep entered at the Royal Adelaide Show must be from an ovine Brucellosis free accredited flock NOTE: Entries will not be processed unless the ovine Brucellosis free accredited flock number is stated on the entry form. All interstate breeders must supply a copy of an Accreditation Free Document from their State Health Department.

PEN ALLOCATION

Please advise total number of sheep excluding lambs at foot on the entry form. Any exhibitor wishing to move their sheep must notify the office and obtain the Supervisor's permission.

EXHIBITS

All sheep when penned, shall be under the control of the Society's officials for the purpose of being placed before the Judge for decision, and shall not be removed or withdrawn from competition by the exhibitor.

Ineligible sheep may be removed at the discretion of the committee.

All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor on the day of entry.

Should there be any reason to suspect that any exhibit is either diseased or dangerous, or not of acceptable Show standard, the Society reserves the right of refusing its admittance to or removing the same from the Showground at the exhibitor's expense.

LAMBPLAN LAMB PRODUCTION CLASSES

No Lambplan EBV's will be permitted to be displayed at any time within the breed assessment but should be worn during the Interbreed Judging and the award presentation on Sunday. Any exhibits not adhering to this regulation will be disqualified.

TECHNICAL REFERENCE COMMITTEE

A Technical Reference Committee appointed by the Society shall -

- 1. Determine ages of sheep.
- 2. Discard those not shorn in accordance with shearing regulations.
- 3. Discard Other Than Merino sheep whose teeth have been tampered with.
- 4. Discard any sheep which are not in a satisfactory show condition.
- 5. Discard Other Than Merino sheep whose testicles do not meet acceptable standard.
- 6. Discard sheep where birth dates do not match the class in which they are entered

The decisions of the Committee shall be conclusive and binding.

The Committee shall be so directed, that in determining exhibits' ages other than Poll Dorset and White Suffolk sheep in the under 1½ year classes shall not be showing more than two permanent teeth up through the gums. Any sheep disqualified because of not complying with this regulation will be permitted to transfer to another class.

Both rams and ewes may be accepted for over 1½ year and under 2½ year classes even if they are showing up to six teeth, except for Merino and Poll Merino March Shorn classes, where sheep may show no more than four teeth up or through the gums, if in the Committee's opinion they are otherwise eligible. The age of Poll Dorset, White Suffolk, Hampshire Down, Suffolk and Texel exhibits shall be determined by the exhibit's birth date. Merino sheep showing more than two permanent teeth up or through the gums, and entered in the under 1½ year classes, will not be transferred to another class, unless shorn and tagged in accordance with the shearing regulations.

The age of sheep shall be taken as at 1 September of the current year.

HORMONES

As stipulated in the Society General Regulations - Prohibited Drugs, sheep which have been treated with hormones are NOT ELIGIBLE for entry or for exhibition at the Royal Adelaide Show.

The RA&HS reserves the right to test any animal that is entered for the Show.

Merino and Poll Merino

The opinion of the Technical Reference Committee will determine the number if permanent teeth up or through the gums for each exhibit.

DISPLAY AND SALE CARDS

Display and Sale Cards shall be A4 size only. Any other form of advertising material will not be permitted.

EXHIBIT CARDS

Exhibitors are requested not to remove withdrawn animal's exhibit cards from pens before judging.

STUD NAMES/PREFIXES

Stud names/prefixes shall not be permitted on sheep handler/holders in the judging ring.

EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE

The use of personal electric jugs is not permitted in the Sheep Pavilion.

PEN CLEANING

Exhibitors shall, to the satisfaction of the Sheep Supervisor:

- 1. Keep each pen allotted to them, and their sheep, in a clean and proper condition throughout the Show.
- 2. Clean out their pens not later than 8.00 am each day.
- 3. Refrain from sweeping into gangways after 8.00 am each day.

PENALTY FOR NON-EXHIBITION OF ANIMALS

Every animal entered must be exhibited unless a certificate signed by the exhibitor is lodged with the Society at least 14 days before the opening day of the Show, stating that the animal is unable to compete for one of the following reasons:

- 1. the animal has died,
- 2. the animal is unfit for exhibition due to injury or disease,
- 3. the animal has become ineligible for the class entered,
- 4. some other cause which the Society considers reasonable.

Any later scratching's must also be notified either by a statutory declaration signed by the exhibitor or a certificate signed by the exhibitor, together with an explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon.

Exhibitors who do not comply with this rule will be fined \$20 for each animal not exhibited (a margin of 10% is allowed).

WASHING OF LEGS

Washing the legs of sheep on RA&HS premises will not be permitted.

DEPARTURE OF SHEEP

Refer to timetables on inside of front cover and in the Merino, Poll Merino, Prime SAMM section.

Breeds other than Merino - Monday 1 September and prior to 6am on Tuesday 2 September .

Merino and Poll Merino – Sale Sheep after the Sheep Sale on Friday 5 September all other sheep will be expected to remain until Sunday 7 September.

Applications for permits to remove sheep at any time must be lodged with the Sheep Supervisor.

FRAUDULENT OR DISCREDITABLE CONDUCT

Any person who is proved to have been guilty of any fraudulent or discreditable conduct in connection with any entry or exhibit, may, in addition to forfeiting all prize money awarded, be debarred from competing or winning a prize at any Show held by this Society for such period as the Council may decide.

No member of the Inspection Committee shall sign an Inspection Certificate until he has seen one member of the Committee actually measure the length of the wool staple on each of the sheep mentioned in the Inspection Certificate and is satisfied that the wool is of the requisite length.

Neither the Association nor any member of the Committee shall be responsible for any damage done to, or injuries sustained by any sheep in the course of an inspection, whether as a direct or indirect result of the punching of the ear of any sheep, and/or the affixing of the ear tag or otherwise. Every owner of sheep submitted for inspection shall sign an agreement whereby he shall exonerate the Association and the members of the Inspection Committee from any such liability. The Association shall not be liable to pay to any member of the said Inspection Committee any fee or other consideration for services rendered as an Inspector, nor shall the Association be liable to pay any expenses incurred by the exhibitor and/ or the members of the Inspection Committee in connection with the making of any inspection.

INTERSTATE SHEARING INSPECTIONS

Inspections of shearing in other States will be accepted by the Society and must be included with entry form.

CLEAN TAGS

To facilitate identification and inspection, all ears and ear tags must be clean before sheep are penned.

MOST SUCCESSFUL EXHIBITOR AWARDS

The following formula will be used to calculate the Most Successful Exhibitor awards at this year's Royal Adelaide Show. (General Classes)

In classes with 1 to 6 exhibits; 3 points for first, 2 points for second and 1 point for third.

In classes with 7 to 10 exhibits; 4,3,2,1 points.

In classes with 11 to 15 exhibits; 5,4,3,2,1.

In classes with 16 exhibits or over; 6,5,4,3,2,1.

In any class if, (e.g.), two seconds are awarded, the points allocated for 2nd and 3rd will be totalled and divided equally between the two second place winners.

If a tie exists a count back approved by the Society will be made to determine the winner.

REGULATIONS FOR ALL BREEDS OF SHEEP

3. The jaw must not extend beyond the pad.

REGULATIONS FOR MERINO SHEEP

OBJECTIVE MEASUREMENT OF THE CURRENT WOOL ON MERINO & POLL MERINO SHEEP

1. All Merino and Poll Merino sheep (rams and ewes) regulation shorn and tagged with an official eartag that are to be exhibited at the Royal Adelaide Show are to have mid-side samples of the current wool growing on that sheep taken, collected by a two person independent collection team and submitted for testing.

2. Wool tests to be carried out by the Australian Wool Testing Authority at the same time as the Adelaide Ram Sale tests are conducted.

3. Sheep may be entered in any class of the exhibitors choice, provided that a sheep entered are applicable for that class.

4. Master sheets of test results in stud order to be made available to the Technical Reference Committee prior to inspection.

5. a. Cards indicating regulation eartag number, micron, SD, C/V and C/F are to be produced.

b. Cards are to be placed in the pen adjacent to the exhibit pen card, prior to inspection by the Technical Reference Committee.

Cards are to be placed on the back of the head card prior to judging.

6. Judge can refer to the test figures as displayed on each exhibit if he wishes.

Wool quality of all sheep exhibited will be determined by the wool test results not their visual counts. ADD IN THE MICRON RANGES FOR MERINO.

Shearing

Each sheep (other than those entered in March Shorn Classes) may be shorn before, on, or after the fifteenth day of August of the year preceding the Royal Adelaide Show at which it is to be exhibited, but at the time of inspection of such sheep, it shall carry only such wool as having regard to natural growth, and shall not exceed in length the equivalent of 12.5 mm as at 15 August.

An Inspection Committee, as is hereinafter mentioned, shall inspect all sheep to be exhibited in all classes other than under 1½ years old. This inspection shall be made by 22 September preceding such Royal Adelaide Show. The intending exhibitor shall be responsible for arranging the inspection and seeing that it is carried out.

If any sheep is inspected after 15 August of the year preceding the show, the Inspection Committee shall allow a growth at the rate of one millimetre per three days with a 30 day cut off date for wool length being 15 September, with a maximum allowable length of 22.5 mm as at 15 September preceding such Show. Sheep inspected after 15 September may be late tagged to the maximum allowable length of 22.5 mm.

No sheep being 18 months or over at the commencement of the said Royal Adelaide Show shall be eligible for exhibition at that Show unless it bears the Association's inspection tag corresponding with the Certificate of Inspection.

Any sheep under 18 months shall not be eligible for Championship or Grand Championship awards unless shorn and tagged in accordance with the shearing regulations.

Shearing – March Shorn Classes

The conditions for March Shorn classes are exactly the same as above with the exception that sheep may be shorn before, on or after 1 March of the current year, but at the time of inspection of such sheep it shall carry such wool as having regard to natural growth and shall not exceed in length the equivalent of 12.5 mm as at 1 March.

If any sheep is inspected after 1 March of the current year, the Inspection Committee shall allow a growth at the rate of one millimetre per three days, with a 30 day cut off date for wool length being 1 April, with a maximum allowable length of 22.5 mm as at 1 April of the current year. Sheep inspected after 1 April may be late tagged to the maximum allowable length of 22.5 mm with this inspection being made by 9 April preceding such Royal Adelaide Show.

Inspection of Sheep

All sheep must be inspected by a Committee comprising two Inspectors, both of whom shall be Members of the South Australian Stud Merino Sheepbreeders' Association contained in a Panel of Member inspectors filed by the Association with the Royal Agricultural and Horticultural Society of South Australia. No such Committee Member shall bear any relationship to the owner or have any financial interest in any flock submitted for inspection.

No members of the Inspection Committee shall sign an Inspection Certificate until he has seen one member of the Committee actually measure the length of the wool of each of the sheep mentioned in the Inspection Certificate, with an approved measuring device and is satisfied that the wool is of the requisite length.

After each such inspection the Committee must affix an ear tag in the unregistered ear of the sheep inspected. With the permission of the Committee the owner may affix the tag. To enable the ear tags to be affixed, the Committee may authorise the owner or one of their number to punch the ear of the sheep.

Any ear tag affixed by or with the permission of the Inspection Committee shall be made of approved material and shall bear approved lettering on one side - together with the year of inspection and on the other side shall be branded with an identification number and letter.

Certificate of Inspection

After inspection the Committee shall issue an Inspection Certificate covering all sheep inspected by them. This Certificate shall be in the form prescribed by the Association and shall be signed in triplicate by each member of the Inspection Committee; one copy (yellow) of this Inspection Certificate shall be handed to the owner of the sheep inspected, the other two copies shall be forwarded to the Executive Officer of the Association who will hand one copy to the Royal Agricultural and Horticultural Society by 15

November and 30 June respectively.

A copy of the shearing certificate of inspection must accompany interstate tagged entries.

Every such Inspection Certificate shall contain particulars of the following:

- 1. Date of inspection.
- 2. Date of shearing as certified by owner.
- 3. Age of each sheep.
- 4. The registered ear mark of each sheep.
- 5. Any brands, ear marks or tattoo marks.
- 6. The letters and numbers of the Association's official ear tags.
- 7. Horn brands or other distinguishing marks.
- 8. Details of ear tags destroyed by Inspection Committee.

Any other matters which the Committee considers appropriate to be brought to the notice of the Association.

ROYAL ADELAIDE SHOW - EXHIBITORS CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

HAZARD REPORTING

Exhibitors must notify the Area/Pavilion Supervisor or the Venue Control Centre immediately of any hazards detected. Hazards are any situation which has the potential to cause:

- I. Injury, illness or death to people or animals either immediately or in the future
- 2. Damage or destruction to property

INCIDENT REPORTING

Exhibitors must notify the Area/Pavilion Supervisor or the Venue Management Office immediately an incident occurs which has resulted in:

- 1. The injury, illness or death of any person or animal
- 2. The damage, destruction or loss of property
- 3. A near miss incident that could have resulted in the consequences listed in 1 and 2

WASTE DISPOSAL

All waste including liquids must be disposed of responsibly and placed in the appropriate bin or receptacle. Storm drains must not be used for the disposal of any waste.

HAZARD MINIMISATION

All areas must be kept in a clean and tidy order with clearly defined and available access and exit routes at all times. Buildup of combustible waste must be avoided.

Care must be taken to minimise trip hazards and obstacles that people may walk into.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

The RA&HS are to be advised of all hazardous materials that are brought onto the Showground. Appropriate warning signs and Safety Data Sheets (SDS) will need to be provided before allowing these materials on site. SDS are to be available onsite and provided immediately upon request by an RA&HS Representative.

MEDIA COMMENTS

Any public comment on emergencies, incidents or other venue matters should only come from the RA&HS. The key media spokesperson for the RA&HS is the Marketing Manager.

DUTY OF CARE

It is important to ensure your own safety and that of all other site personnel, visitors and general public at the Adelaide Showground.

All exhibitors have a "Duty of Care" to avoid exposing themselves or other people to situations which could lead to injury. This "Duty of Care" extends to the prevention of damage to property.

LIABILITY AND INDEMNITY

1. Release

Entry to and remaining on the Showground is entirely at the risk of the Exhibitor and to the maximum extent permitted by law, the Exhibitor releases the Society (which term includes in this clause the Society's officers, employees, members and agents), from all claims and demands of every kind resulting from any accident, damage or injury occurring at the Showground, and without limitation, the Exhibitor acknowledges:

 a) the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to or caused by any Exhibit;

b) the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to or caused by any Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees and Agents;

c) the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to a Motor Vehicle or any of its contents whilst it is located on the Showground; and

d) without limiting Regulations 1 (a), 1 (b) and (c) above, the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury resulting from the sale, treatment, failure to treat, destruction, disposal or other dealing with any Exhibit, or for loss, damage or injury to any personal belongings, equipment or property brought onto the Showground.

2. Indemnity

To the maximum extent permitted by law, the Exhibitor must indemnify and keep indemnified the Society and its officers,

employees, members and agents from and against all actions, claims, demands, losses, damages, costs, expenses and liabilities including without limitation, consequential loss and loss of profits for which the Society is or may be or become liable in respect of or arising from:

a) loss, damage or injury to any person in connection with the Exhibit or the relevant Event;

b) without limiting Regulation 2(a), loss, damage or injury to any other Exhibit or Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees, Agents, or to the property of the Society, or its members, or to the general public, caused or contributed to or by any act or omission of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor or by the Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees or Agents; and

c) without limiting Regulation 2(a), loss, damage or injury to the Exhibit, or the Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees, or Agents caused or contributed by an act or omission of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor or by the transportation, feeding or housing of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor.

3. Removal from Showground

Without prejudice to any other provision in these Regulations, where the Society, its officers, employees, members or agents removes an Exhibit, or causes an Exhibit to be removed from the Showground, the Exhibit is removed or caused to be removed entirely at the risk of the Exhibitor. The person or persons removing the Exhibit will be deemed to be the agent of the Exhibitor, and his or her acts and omissions will be deemed to be the acts and omissions of the Exhibitor.

4. Insurance

The Society will arrange Animal Exhibitors Public Liability insurance cover for all Exhibitors of Exhibits being animals. The Exhibitor is bound by the terms and conditions of this insurance and by Statutory Duties as defined under the Insurance Contracts Act (1984). Details of the Animal Exhibitors Public Liability insurance are set out in the Relevant Schedule. The Society does not insure first party loss, damage or injury to Exhibits, and Exhibitors should consider purchasing insurance if required.

5. Personal effects

The Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss or damage caused to personal belongings, equipment or property which is brought onto the Showground by an Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees or Agents.

EMERGENCY INFORMATION

Emergency information and Emergency Assembly Points for the various animal pavilions and stables will be included with Exhibitor List of Entries and Notice to Exhibitor notifications. Competitors should be familiar with these plans.

FIRST AID

During the Royal Adelaide Show, St John provides First Aid Services but it is suggested that competitors have a basic First Aid kit for minor medical requirements.

St John is not in attendance after public hours.

For emergency contact details, check Notice Boards for onsite assistance or dial 000 for a medical emergency.

RA&HS EMERGENCY FACILITIES

Firefighting and other emergency equipment must not be removed or used for any other purpose. Missing or unserviceable equipment should be reported to the Venue Control Centre immediately.

SMOKING

Smoking is only permitted in designated locations. The Royal Adelaide Show is a smoke free event.

TRAFFIC CONTROL

The RA&HS Traffic Control Policy imposes speed restrictions within the Showground. For the duration of the Royal Adelaide Show the speed limit is 10 kph on the grounds and 8 kph inside buildings.

The use of vehicles inside the Showground is closely managed during the Royal Adelaide Show. Conditions of entry will be provided with the issue of Vehicle Entry Permits.
