ENTRY INFORMATION

HOW TO ENTER

- Complete the online form at www.theshow.com.au
- Deadline: Friday 17 July 2026 at 5:00 PM CST
- Entries must be registered, no “pending” registrations will be accepted.
- The main emphasis of entries is the number of spaces required.
- The Committee reserves the right to impose a fine per space not occupied by an exhibit.
 - 1 space - \$50 per space
 - 2 spaces - \$60 per space
 - 3 spaces - \$70 per space
 - 4 spaces - \$80 per space
 - 5 or more spaces - \$110 per space
- Details of all animals entered must be submitted at the time of entry.
- Substitute animals will be permitted by the advised closing date.
- Exhibitors shall not bring onto the Adelaide Showground any more animals than spaces booked.
- All entries are subject to approval by individual breed societies that all exhibit details are correct.
- Animals must be entered in general classes to qualify for group classes
- Cattle will be catalogued in age order.
- Only cattle which are entered for competition will be permitted to enter the Showground.

- All withdrawals must include exhibitor name, exhibit name, class number and exhibit number (if known).
- Withdrawals can be sent via email to entries@adelaideshowground.com.au and clearly marked "Withdrawal - Dairy Cattle Section".
- Verbal withdrawals will not be accepted.

REFUNDS

- No refund of entry fees will be made after the initial closing date of entries.

TRANSFERS

- Please ensure cattle are entered in the correct class at the time of entry.

PARKING & LOGISTICS

LEADER STREET CARPARK

- Must be booked when completing your entries.
- Limited availability.

STOCK TRUCK PARKING – MAGIC MILLIONS

- Parking will be available for all trucks, floats, and trailers at Magic Millions.
- Access to this area will be via the corner of Park and Wattle Terraces.
- **No trucks will be permitted to park on the Showground.**

STOCK MOVEMENTS

- It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to adhere to Australian Welfare Standards and Guidelines regarding safe transport of livestock.
- The Society will notify the NLIS database of all movements onto the Showground on behalf of exhibitors.

UNLOADING/LOADING

- All cattle must be unloaded and loaded in the designated areas.
- Cattle are not permitted onsite prior to the designated times without approval from the RA&HS.
- All departure applications are to be submitted to the Dairy Cattle Office 24 hours prior to departure.
- Exhibitors are not permitted to remove their cattle from the pavilions until their allotted departure time. (Fines may be issued)

AGES OF CATTLE

- Cow, 3 years old, in milk (01/07/23 – 31/12/23)
- Cow, 2 ½ years old, in milk (01/01/24 – 30/06/24)
- Cow, 2 years old, in milk (01/07/24 – 31/12/24)
- Cow or Heifer, over 2 years old, dry (before 01/07/24)
- Heifer, under 2 years, dry (after 30/06/24)
- Heifer, 2 years old, dry (01/07/24 – 31/12/24)
- Heifer, 18 months old (01/01/25 – 30/06/25)
- Heifer, yearling (01/07/25 – 31/12/25)
- Heifer, born from January, current year (01/01/26 – 30/04/26)

TYPE & PRODUCTION GUIDELINES

- A special ribbon will be awarded to the top butterfat + protein producer among ribbon winners in female classes aged 3 years and older.
- Production data must come from a certificate provided by the exhibitor.
- Use the most recently completed lactation of **305 days or less**.
 - If the current lactation isn't complete or hasn't reached 305 days, use the previous lactation **only if it was completed or reached 305 days after July 1 of the previous year**.
 - All lactations used must be **no more than 305 days**.
- Exhibitors must submit production certificates to the **Dairy Cattle Office by 12:00 noon on Sunday, 6 September**.
- Accepted production figures include:
 - Official tests
 - Recorder sampling
 - Owner sampling

TYPE & PRODUCTION CLASS SCORING

- Score = 1 point for every 5 kg of fat + protein above the age standard.
- Age standards:

- In the case of a draw, a 75% ratio factor will be introduced to decide the winner.

ANIMAL HEALTH

SICK OR INJURED ANIMALS

- Any cattle considered either **diseased or dangerous**, or not of acceptable Show standard, the Society reserves the right of refusing its admittance to or removing the same from the Showground at the exhibitor's expense.
- If a qualified vet appointed by the Society determines that an animal is seriously sick, injured, or unfit to remain at the Showground, the Society may:
 - Require the exhibitor to remove the animal immediately, or
 - Arrange for the animal to be removed or humanely destroyed if necessary.
- If the exhibitor does not act within the time given, the Society will remove the animal and charge the exhibitor for all related costs.
- The exhibitor is fully responsible for the animal at all times, including any person handling or removing it on their behalf.
- The exhibitor must cover any costs, damages, or claims resulting from the animal's condition, transport, or care.
- The pavilion supervisor must be notified immediately if a vet treats any sick or diseased animal.
- All veterinary costs during the Show are the exhibitor's responsibility.

REQUIREMENTS

- Johne's Disease: Minimum Dairy Score 3
- Animals over 2 years must be blood tested 90 days prior.
- Ringworm:
 - Vet certificate required if treated
 - Additional washing, no more than 4 days apart
- Animals must not have been exposed to any communicable/notifiable disease/s within 14 days prior to the show.

DOCUMENTATION

- NLIS eartag required.
- National Cattle Health Statement required at unloading
- Vendor Declarations must be presented to the Dairy Cattle Office by 12noon Sunday.

GENERAL INFORMATION

REGISTRATION & OWNERSHIP

- All cattle must be registered in the appropriate Stud Book.
 - Entries for Appendix 1 and 2 animals will be accepted in the Guernsey and Holstein sections only.
 - In the Illawarra section, animals that are the progeny of a sire and a dam that are both registered in the Illawarra Herd Book and also comply with the Federal Illawarra Show Policy are eligible to be shown.
- Exhibitors must be current members of their breed society. (Excluding schools)
- Cattle must be owned or leased (with written proof) by the exhibitor at the time of entry.
- Digital or paper copies of registrations will be accepted.

INSPECTION OF CATTLE

- Exhibitors must make Registration Certificates available to Breed inspectors if requested.
- All cattle will be inspected for;
 - identification tattoo and/or NLIS tag, photo, freeze brand, ear tags.
- Any exhibit not complying with the above regulations may need to be removed from the Showground within 12 hours of notification being given to the exhibitor at the exhibitor's cost.

CATTLE

- Cattle must not be rugged while the Show is open to the public.
- Feeding of animals is not permitted outside the Cattle Pavilions at any time.
- Animals must not be tethered in unauthorised areas.
- Cattle must be secured.
- Any calf born during the Show must be inaccessible to the public.

EXHIBITORS' CARDS

- Exhibitors are not permitted to display any awards on their animal/s or pen/s other than those issued or approved of by the Society for the current Show.
- Exhibitors can supply their own display cards which show the animals catalogue number, name of exhibit, date of birth, name of sire and dam, name of exhibitor.

GRAND PARADE & JUDGING RING

- Handlers under the age of 10 years must be accompanied by a competent person including sign holders.
- Cattle must be handled and/or controlled by a competent handler of at least 8 years of age in the judging ring.
- Approved Breed Uniforms or neat attire must be worn.

FACILITIES & EQUIPMENT

CLEANING & WASTE

- Keep your area clean and presentable throughout the Show.
- Bring your own wheelbarrow and buckets.
- Use manure bins only for manure — not general rubbish.
- Non organic matter must be removed before leaving.
- Fines may apply for non-compliance.

BEDDING

- Only sawdust is allowed (no straw).
- Bedding boards are allowed (bring your own) not exceeding the yellow line in the pavilions.
- Feature Breed and schools can be supplied concrete barriers if available.

CLIPPING CHUTE SPACES

- Clipping chute spaces must be purchased and will not be permitted to be placed in spaces booked for animals.
- Clipping is not permitted between 11.00 pm and 5.00 am.
- Any Exhibitor seen disregarding these requests will not be permitted to parade for judging.

FEED LOFT ACCESS

- Feed and gear can be stored in the lofts (not exceeding maximum weight).
- Do not walk on the lofts under any circumstances.
- **No flammable or feed to be stored on lofts under lockers in the Brick Dairy.**

EXERCISE AREA

- Cattle must only be exercised on the Dairy Cattle Lawn

WASHING OF STOCK

- Use only designated wash bays.
- Bring your own hose with standard fittings.
- No powered equipment allowed in wash bays.

LOCKERS

- Lockers must be booked when submitting your entry.
- Availability is limited and not guaranteed.
- Exhibitors with 1–8 spaces will receive 1 locker.
- Exhibitors with more than 8 spaces may apply for up to 2 lockers.
- Exhibitors **under 15** must be accompanied by an adult to stay overnight and will not be permitted to purchase a locker.
- Cooking or heating devices are not allowed in lockers.
- Unauthorized use of lockers will result in a \$100 fine and loss of locker privileges for the next Show.
- Lockers cannot be moved or changed without approval from RA&HS Dairy Cattle Councilors.
- Schools will receive complimentary lockers for storage only.

FODDER STORE

- Located at the western end of the Tin Dairy.
- All sales are credit card only.
- Bring your own feed or purchase from the store.
- Excess fodder may be removed at the Committee's discretion.
- Exhibitors must not sell or promote fodder on the Showground.

CONDUCT & SAFETY

SMOKING & ALCOHOL

- Smoking/vaping only in designated areas.
- Smoking/vaping is prohibited in sheds.
- Alcohol is only allowed in designated areas.
- No alcohol or food preparation in lockers.

ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT

- All electrical items must be tag tested.
- Double adaptors are strictly prohibited.

SAFETY

- Hi viz clothing are to be worn at all time while bumping in.
- Pre Show inductions must be completed prior to arrival.

DUTY OF CARE

- All competitors have a "Duty of Care" to avoid exposing themselves or other people to situations which could lead to injury.
- This "Duty of Care" extends to the prevention of damage to property.

SOFT FURNISHINGS

- Soft furnishings are not permitted in the Dairy Cattle Pavilions (e.g. lounge chairs etc.) Excluding bedding in lockers.
- Any soft furnishing must be removed at the exhibitors cost.
- Fines may occur.

DAIRY SHOW ETHICS

The Dairy Section follows the **National Code of Ethics** created by the **All Dairy Breeds Show Ring Committee (ADBSRC)**. This code ensures that all dairy animals are shown in their **natural form**, without any unethical alterations.

EXHIBITOR RESPONSIBILITIES

- Read and understand the full [Code of Ethics](#).
- Ensure your animals and anyone involved in their preparation follow the Code at all times on the Adelaide Showground.
- Exhibitors will be held accountable for any breaches of their fitters, handlers and workers.

KEY REGULATIONS

- **Udder Scanning:**
 - All milking cows **will be** scanned before entering the ring.
 - After scanning, cows **cannot return to the Pavilion**.
 - This is to detect unethical udder manipulation (e.g., overfilling).
 - Cows showing signs of stress must be **milked out immediately** and will be **disqualified**.
 - **Present the scanning receipt** to the steward when entering the ring.
- **Top Line Hair Check:**
 - Hair on the cow's top line may be measured randomly.
 - Maximum allowed height: **3.8 cm**.
- **Violations of All Dairy Breeds Code of Ethics:**
 - **First offence:** Animal is withdrawn from all classes at the current Show.
 - **Second offence:** Animal is withdrawn, and exhibitor is **banned for 1 year**.
 - **Third offence:** Exhibitor is **banned for 5 years**.

EXHIBITION DAIRY GUIDELINES

DAIRY COMPLEX OVERVIEW

- A 12-unit licensed dairy is located in the **north-west corner of Tin Dairy**.
- **All cows must be milked here**, unless special permission is granted by the Dairy Cattle Committee.
- Opens for milking at **3:00 pm on Thursday 3 September**.
- The dairy will **close twice daily for cleaning**. Times will be announced during the Show.

RULES & REGULATIONS

- **Treatment & Milk Safety:**
 - If a cow has been treated or its milk is unsafe, a **Treatment Report Form** must be submitted to the Dairy Manager before milking.
 - Cows with **infectious milk** must be milked on the **red side outside the dairy**.
 - Cows with **non-infectious but unfit milk** must be milked on the **blue side outside the dairy**.
- **Milking Procedures:**
 - **No portable milking machines** unless approved.
 - Cows to be identified whilst in the Dairy.
 - **Problem-milk cows** must use one of the **three outside units**.
 - Cows may be **sampled and tested** for milk quality.
 - **Milk proceeds** may be credited to exhibitors at the Society's discretion.
- **Hygiene & Safety:**
 - **Pre-spray and clean udders** before milking; allow at least **1 minute contact time** before wiping.
 - **Peracetic acid** must be used only to sterilise cups prior to milking. Iodine will not be permitted.
 - **Water must be used to clean teats prior to milking NOT iodine-based solution.**
 - **Spray teats with iodine-based solution** after milking.
 - **Remove rugs** from cattle during milking.
 - **No injections or udder infusions** in the dairy; teat sprays and creams are allowed.
 - **No alcohol, drugs, or smoking** in or near the dairy.
- **Dress Code:**
 - All workers must be **properly dressed**.
 - **Aprons required** during afternoon milking.
 - **No thongs or bare feet** allowed.
- **Operations:**
 - Dairy Managers oversee all operations.
 - Milking order is set by Dairy Management.
 - Missed milking slots will be rescheduled to the end of the session.
 - Dairy closes at the Manager's discretion.
 - Leave the dairy **clean after use**; hosing out is encouraged.
 - **Do not leave machines running** if no cows are being milked. **PLEASE TURN OFF.**
 - Disputes go to the Dairy Manager and will be resolved by the Dairy Cattle & Pig Committee.

CONTAMINATED MILK RESPONSIBILITY

If an exhibitor's milk contaminates a bulk tank or tanker, they are financially responsible for:

- Transport and disposal of the milk.
- Value of all contaminated milk, plus transport and disposal.

Exhibitors may choose to dispose of contaminated milk on their own property.

Contaminated milk includes: antibiotic traces, colostrum, blood, or strong taints/smells.

PRIZES & AWARDS

- We aim to ensure all listed prizes are accurate at the time of publishing.
- If a sponsor withdraws a prize, it will revert to the default amount.

Champion Selection

- Champions, Reserve Champion, Honorable Mention are chosen from 1st and 2nd prize winners.
- Reserve Champions are selected from remaining 2nd prize winners in the same class.
- If a breed has fewer than 5 head, 1 overall champion will be awarded only.

MOST SUCCESSFUL EXHIBITOR - INDIVIDUAL BREEDS

- Points to be allotted as follows:
 - First, 3 points
 - Second, 2 points
 - Third, 1 point
- In the event of a tie,
 - Senior & Intermediate Champion earns +3 points
 - Juvenile Champion and all Reserve Champions earn +2 points
 - Juvenile Reserve Champion earns +1 point
 - Fourth, Fifth & Six will be considered
- Points are awarded regardless of the number of entries in each class.

PAYMENT OF PRIZE MONEY

- Prize money will be paid via EFT by the end of October.
- Unclaimed prizes by 11 December will be forfeited.

GOODS AND SERVICES TAX (GST)

- Prize money listed in the schedule does not include GST.
- If you're GST registered and provide your ABN:
 - RA&HS will add GST to your prize money.
 - A Recipient Created Tax Invoice will be issued.
- By confirming GST registration, you agree:
 - Not to issue your own tax invoice for prize money
 - To notify RA&HS if your GST status changes
- If you are not registered for GST (or are entering as a hobbyist)
 - Prize money will be paid without GST.
