Please Note: All plants are to be removed on the date specified above; any remaining plants will be disposed of by the Society. (unless prior arrangements are made with the RA&HS representatives)
Interstate Exhibitors must ensure that they make their own arrangements for the Quarantine, Transportation, Staging and Removal of their Exhibits.

ATTENTION ALL EXHIBITORS

In an endeavour to make the Royal Adelaide Show Aroid and Orchid Competition relevant, all classes are reviewed annually. Suggestions for alterations to the 2027 Competition should be submitted in writing to the RA&HS by the end of October 2026.

HOW TO ENTER

The Royal Agricultural and Horticultural Society of South Australia encourages people of all ages to enter competitive horticulture at the Royal Adelaide Show. We believe you will find it a most rewarding experience. These notes are intended to help you. This Prize Schedule includes the Conditions of Entry, closing dates for entry and other important general information. It also provides information about the specific requirements for the various sections and classes available for entry. Please read the Prize Schedule carefully.
Entries can be placed online by 5pm on the closing date.

Once your entry has been received, checked and processed, you will receive all the necessary information required to bring your entries onto the Showground for staging and judging.
Exhibitors must bring along their payment receipt as proof of payment and entry so the details can be matched with exhibitor number.
Exhibit cards will be provided when exhibits are delivered upon presentation of your List of Entries printout on your receipt.

CLOSING DATE OF ENTRIES

The Royal Adelaide Show Aroid and Orchid Competition has been established in agreement with the Royal Agricultural and Horticultural Society of South Australia Inc. It creates a premier aroid and orchid show which offers a series of highly prestigious competitions open to growers throughout Australia and beyond.

CLOSING DATE OF ENTRIES

The following conditions will strictly apply:

- All entries must be in the Societies possession **by 5.00 pm on Friday 7 August.**
- When sending entry forms and fees by post, the onus is on the exhibitor to ensure adequate delivery time.
- Entry forms by facsimile or email will not be accepted.
- Absolutely no exception to the above conditions will be made to any exhibitor under any circumstance.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF YOUR ENTRY

Entries placed on line will be acknowledged by email.

ENTRY FEES (GST INCLUDED)

Open Section \$5.00 per plant
School Orchid Competition \$4.00 per plant
Group Display Entry – \$25 per display
Entries are to be made on line.

PAYMENT OF FEES

When paying fees, exhibitors must ensure that sufficient funds are available at the time of entry. Failure to do so may result in non-

The RA&HS reserves the right to inform prize sponsors of the details of recipients to enable distribution of their voucher/product prizes.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

Exhibitors are reminded that the Society's General Regulations apply to all sections of the Show. A copy of the General Regulations can be obtained from the Society's website at www.theshow.com.au or from the Society's Administration Office. Exhibitors should note that the General Regulations contain a number of provisions relevant to competitions and this Schedule including but not limited to, offences, penalties, prohibited drugs. As those conditions apply in addition to the regulations contained within this schedule, Exhibitors should familiarise themselves with the General Regulations.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS

Exhibitors are reminded that the Special Regulations contained within this Schedule are merely supplementary to and subject to the General Regulations.

The members of the Society's Horticulture Committee shall have the authority to act on behalf of the Society to take any necessary action under these Special Regulations.

SUBMISSION & RESTRICTIONS OF ENTRIES

Plants must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor for a minimum of 40 days prior to close of entries.

An Exhibitor in the **School Section** must be a **current Primary or Secondary School Student**.

If the number of exhibits exceeds the space available, the Society reserves the right to display prize winning exhibits only.

PARKING

Exhibitors Parking for drop off and pick up only will be in Rose Terrace Car Park 1 - entrance from Rose Terrace.

TRANSFERS

Please ensure exhibits are entered in the correct class at the time of entry. No exhibit will be transferred to another class after the closing date of entries.

EXHIBIT CARDS

Exhibitors must bring along their payment receipt as proof of payment and entry so the details can be matched with exhibitor number.

Exhibit cards will be provided when exhibits are delivered upon presentation of your List of Entries printout on your receipt.

All entries should have their Exhibit Card securely attached to the plant and in a position which is clearly visible from the front of the plant.

If known, plants should also be correctly labelled with the genus and full name of the plant displayed on the plant so it can be easily identified.

WITHDRAWALS

All withdrawals must be made in writing and can be sent via email to entries@adelaideshowground.com.au. Emailed withdrawals must include "Withdrawal" in the subject line and the section (eg Aroid and Orchid Section), exhibitor name, class number, exhibit number (if known) and exhibit name (if applicable). Withdrawals must be made at least 24 hours prior to judging.

PRIZES & AWARDS

Prize ribbons & Prize Cards will be provided for all first and second place winners.

Third place may be awarded if there are **more** than 10 entries in the class.

It is the exhibitor's responsibility to collect awarded prize cards from their exhibit at the time of removal.

BANKSIAN MEDAL

Awarded for 'Excellence in Horticulture' to any exhibitor who has presented an exhibit for judging in any one of the categories within the official Horticulture, Commercial Fruit or Aroid/Orchid Competitions at the Royal Adelaide Show.

The Medal is awarded in addition to any other prizes won by the exhibitors.

Exhibitors who have received recognition for their exhibit as a 'Champion' in any one of the above sections will be considered eligible.

The judging panel will nominate a champion exhibit from the Orchid section which will be considered with all of the other nominated champions from within all of the Horticulture sections.

PAYMENT OF PRIZE MONEY

All prize money won during the Royal Adelaide Show will be paid by Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) only.

PRIZE MONEY WILL BE PAID BY THE END OF OCTOBER.

Any trophy, prize or prize money not claimed by 11 December of the current year, shall be deemed forfeited by the exhibitor and the RA&HS shall no longer be liable to pay or provide the prize.

PRIZE MONEY AND GST

Prize money as stated in the Competition Schedule does not include GST.

The prize money which we pay to successful exhibitors depends on information provided to us. If you confirm that you are GST registered and provide your Australian Business Number (ABN), we will pay the appropriate prize money plus 10% GST. We will provide you with a Recipient Created Tax Invoice which you will need to submit to the Australian Taxation Office.

If you confirm you are registered for GST, in entering the competition, you acknowledge your agreement to the following:

You will not issue a tax invoice to the RA&HS in respect to prize money received;

You will notify the RA&HS if you cease to be registered for GST.

If you provide your Australian Business Number but are not registered for GST, we will pay the prize money as detailed in the Competition Schedule without reference to the GST.

If you confirm you are entering as part of a private recreational pursuit or hobby, we will pay the prize money as detailed in the Competition Schedule without reference to GST.

IMPORTANT

It is important that you either:

Confirm you are entering as part of a private recreational pursuit or hobby, or

Confirm you are entering as a GST registered business and supply your ABN

Failure to do either of the above will cause the RA&HS to withhold tax, at the maximum tax rate, from your prize money in accordance with Australian tax legislation.

The RA&HS is not a tax consultant and therefore assumes no liability for actions taken as a result of these guidelines. In any instances where an entrant or sponsor is uncertain of the tax implications of their involvement, they should consult their own accountant or tax advisor.

AROIDS AND ORCHIDS 2026

The Society makes every endeavour to ensure all prizes listed are accurate at the time of publishing. Should a cash prize be withdrawn by a sponsor subsequent to publishing, the prize will revert back to the competitions default amount where applicable. Vouchers, product or trophies withdrawn by a sponsor subsequent to publishing will not be replaced. It is the responsibility of the prize winner to follow-up with the Society any sponsored prize (cash, voucher, product, trophy) they believe they are entitled to prior to 30 November in the year of the prize being awarded. The Society will not follow-up prize sponsors after this date or review any prizes that may have been incorrectly awarded.

JUDGING

The judge's decision will be final, and no correspondence or discussion will be entered into. In all classes, where a number of species and/or cultivars are called for, judges will take into account the difficulties associated with their cultivation. Judges are empowered to withhold prizes in any class where exhibits are below acceptable standard. They may award second prize in lieu of first.

No exhibitor or exhibitor's agent shall act as a judge or steward in a class in which he/she exhibits.

COMPETITION RULES & REGULATIONS

- Plants and flowers exhibited are to be free from pest infestations or virus.
- All the competitive entries are to have the plant exhibitor number securely attached to the plant in clear vision. Stewards will advise on the method of attachment when plants have been checked.
- There may be different methods of attachment depending on the size and type of plant.
- If known, plants should be correctly labelled with the genus and full name of the plant displayed on the plant so it can be easily identified.
- Any exhibit not displaying the exhibitor's number at the commencement of the judging will not be judged.
- Entries are accepted on condition that they are disease and insect free. Plants may be removed from display if suspected of being diseased or otherwise unhealthy.
- No exhibitor will be allowed to remain in the orchid competition area during judging.
- Exhibits must not be removed from the display before the end of the Show; no blooms shall be removed from the show except under the authority of a RA&HS Representative.
- The RA&HS will under no circumstance hold itself responsible for any loss, damage to, or misdelivery of any exhibit.
- If a plant is damaged during transit to the Show, the stewards should be notified and the plant will be appropriately identified and judges notified accordingly.
- Plants exhibited in a group display may be included as part of any other sections competition.
- Plants entered in the Orchid Competition will not be made available for any additional award judging during the Royal Adelaide Show.
- Please see each Individual Section for specific rules and regulations.

Staking and Tying - Flowers may be supported in the best possible manner for presentation. Staking and Tying for support will be permitted. In all genera, no inflorescence is to be tied or supported on any part of the flower or its attachment to the inflorescence.

DEFINITIONS

- **Seedling** - Seedling shall mean the complete plant grown from seed to flowering for the first time or flowering season. Plants that have been grown on or divided prior to being exhibited on the show bench are not eligible to be shown as seedlings. Clones/Mericlones are not to be included as seedlings. Seedling plants must be clearly identified.
- **Bloom** - one flower displayed on a single stem
- **Cut** - Two or more flowers or florets displayed on a single stem or a stem with secondary branches.
- **Miniature Cymbidiums**. Miniature Cymbidiums are defined as Cymbidiums where the majority of the flowers are less than 60 mm when measured across the widest visible limits of the flower without manipulation.
- **Intermediate Cymbidiums** - Intermediate Cymbidiums are defined as Cymbidiums where the majority of the flowers are greater than 60mm and less than 90mm when measured across the widest visible limits of the flower without manipulation.
- **Standard Cymbidiums** - Standard Cymbidiums are defined as Cymbidiums where the majority of the flowers are greater than 90mm when measured across the widest visible limits of the flower without manipulation.
- **Special awards** – Special awards may be awarded to acknowledge an orchid plant which has outstanding excellence in culture, quality and distinctiveness.

ROYAL ADELAIDE SHOW - EXHIBITORS CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

HAZARD REPORTING

Exhibitors must notify the Area/Pavilion Supervisor or the Venue Control Centre immediately of any hazards detected. Hazards are any situation which has the potential to cause:

1. Injury, illness or death to people or animals either immediately or in the future
2. Damage or destruction to property

INCIDENT REPORTING

Exhibitors must notify the Area/Pavilion Supervisor or the Venue Management Office immediately an incident occurs which has resulted in:

1. The injury, illness or death of any person or animal
2. The damage, destruction or loss of property
3. A near miss incident that could have resulted in the consequences listed in 1 and 2

WASTE DISPOSAL

All waste including liquids must be disposed of responsibly and placed in the appropriate bin or receptacle. Storm drains must not be used for the disposal of any waste.

HAZARD MINIMISATION

All areas must be kept in a clean and tidy order with clearly defined and available access and exit routes at all times. Build-up of combustible waste must be avoided.

Care must be taken to minimise trip hazards and obstacles that people may walk into.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

The RA&HS are to be advised of all hazardous materials that are brought onto the Showground. Appropriate warning signs and Safety Data Sheets (SDS) will need to be provided before allowing these materials on site. SDS are to be available onsite and provided immediately upon request by an RA&HS Representative.

MEDIA COMMENTS

Any public comment on emergencies, incidents or other venue matters should only come from the RA&HS. The key media spokesperson for the RA&HS is the Marketing Manager.

DUTY OF CARE

It is important to ensure your own safety and that of all other site personnel, visitors and general public at the Adelaide Showground.

All exhibitors have a "Duty of Care" to avoid exposing themselves or other people to situations which could lead to injury. This "Duty of Care" extends to the prevention of damage to property.

LIABILITY AND INDEMNITY

1. Release

Entry to and remaining on the Showground is entirely at the risk of the Exhibitor and to the maximum extent permitted by law, the Exhibitor releases the Society (which term includes in this clause the Society's officers, employees, members and agents), from all claims and demands of every kind resulting from any accident, damage or injury occurring at the Showground, and without limitation, the Exhibitor acknowledges:

- a) the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to or caused by any Exhibit;
- b) the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to or caused by any Exhibit, his or her family, invitees and Agents;
- c) the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to a Motor Vehicle or any of its contents whilst it is located on the Showground; and
- d) without limiting Regulations 1 (a), 1 (b) and (c) above, the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury resulting from the sale, treatment, failure to treat, destruction, disposal or other dealing with any Exhibit, or for loss, damage or injury to any personal belongings, equipment or property brought onto the Showground.

2. Indemnity

To the maximum extent permitted by law, the Exhibitor must indemnify and keep indemnified the Society and its officers,

employees, members and agents from and against all actions, claims, demands, losses, damages, costs, expenses and liabilities including without limitation, consequential loss and loss of profits for which the Society is or may be or become liable in respect of or arising from:

- a) loss, damage or injury to any person in connection with the Exhibit or the relevant Event;
- b) without limiting Regulation 2(a), loss, damage or injury to any other Exhibit or Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees, Agents, or to the property of the Society, or its members, or to the general public, caused or contributed to or by any act or omission of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor or by the Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees or Agents; and
- c) without limiting Regulation 2(a), loss, damage or injury to the Exhibit, or the Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees, or Agents caused or contributed by an act or omission of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor or by the transportation, feeding or housing of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor.

3. Removal from Showground

Without prejudice to any other provision in these Regulations, where the Society, its officers, employees, members or agents removes an Exhibit, or causes an Exhibit to be removed from the Showground, the Exhibit is removed or caused to be removed entirely at the risk of the Exhibitor. The person or persons removing the Exhibit will be deemed to be the agent of the Exhibitor, and his or her acts and omissions will be deemed to be the acts and omissions of the Exhibitor.

4. Insurance

The Society will arrange Animal Exhibitors Public Liability insurance cover for all Exhibitors of Exhibits being animals. The Exhibitor is bound by the terms and conditions of this insurance and by Statutory Duties as defined under the Insurance Contracts Act (1984). Details of the Animal Exhibitors Public Liability insurance are set out in the Relevant Schedule. The Society does not insure first party loss, damage or injury to Exhibits, and Exhibitors should consider purchasing insurance if required.

5. Personal effects

The Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss or damage caused to personal belongings, equipment or property which is brought onto the Showground by an Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees or Agents.

EMERGENCY INFORMATION

Emergency information and Emergency Assembly Points for the various animal pavilions and stables will be included with Exhibitor List of Entries and Notice to Exhibitor notifications. Competitors should be familiar with these plans.

FIRST AID

During the Royal Adelaide Show, St John provides First Aid Services but it is suggested that competitors have a basic First Aid kit for minor medical requirements.

St John is not in attendance after public hours.

For emergency contact details, check Notice Boards for onsite assistance or dial 000 for a medical emergency.

RA&HS EMERGENCY FACILITIES

Firefighting and other emergency equipment must not be removed or used for any other purpose. Missing or unserviceable equipment should be reported to the Venue Control Centre immediately.

SMOKING

Smoking is only permitted in designated locations. The Royal Adelaide Show is a smoke free event.

TRAFFIC CONTROL

The RA&HS Traffic Control Policy imposes speed restrictions within the Showground. For the duration of the Royal Adelaide Show the speed limit is 10 kph on the grounds and 8 kph inside buildings.

The use of vehicles inside the Showground is closely managed during the Royal Adelaide Show. Conditions of entry will be provided with the issue of Vehicle Entry Permits.
